## The Answer

I define a competitive auction as one in which each side has at least one 8 card fit and the points are relatively even (17-23 HCP for each side). I use the following guidelines for competitive auctions:

1. Do not let the opponents play at the 2 level.
2. If the opponents are already at the 3 level, only compete to the 3 level if you have a nine card fit or a singleton in the opponent's suit.
3. If the decision is close, I tend to discount high cards in the opponent's suit and value high cards in
our suit or suits.
Keeping those guidelines in mind, here is how I would bid on each of the example auctions.
Auction 1 - This is close. We have a 9 card fit, but I have values in hearts. If playing IMPs, I would pass; if playing match points, I would bid 3S.

Auction 2 - I would bid 3H, since I would like to push the opponents to the 3 level.
Auction 3 - Unlike Auction 1, I think 3S is clear. We have a 9 card fit, and all my values are outside clubs, the opponent's suit.

Auction 4 - unlike Auction 3, we only have an 8 card fit. Therefore, since the opponents are already at the 3 level, I pass. We do not have a 9 card fit, and I do not have a singleton club.

Auction 5 - this is similar to Auction 4. We only have an 8 card fit, and the opponents are already at the 3 level. Additionally, I have heart values. I feel pass is clear.
