This is a two part puzzle.

In Part 1, your objective is to develop a bidding sequence that gets you to a difficult but makable 6H slam. You open the bidding 1H and your LHO overcalls 1S. Construct a bidding sequence to get your side to 6H.

This is an actual hand that I encountered on BBO, and the bidding and play happened as presented. Unfortunately, I was defending and ended up losing 12 IMPS on the hand because my opponents were the only partnership to bid and make slam. There was some good news; one of my opponents was my wife Ava, so at least someone in our family benefited from the good bidding and play!

The Answer

Here is a suggested bidding sequence.

<u>You</u>	<u>LHO</u>	<u>Partner</u>	<u>RHO</u>
1H	1S	2S	Ρ
3D	Р	4H	Р
4S	Р	5C	Р
6H	Р	Р	Ρ

Let me explain each bid:

- 1. Partner's 2S is a heart raise, showing at least 4 hearts and a limit raise or better (10+ HCP).
- 2. At this point in the auction, from your partner's perspective, your 3D bid is a game try. 2S may be invitational, so your partner thinks your 3D bid shows diamond cards and is asking him to bid game with diamond cards or better than a limit raise. You intend to bid game in any case, but by bidding 3D, you will find out whether or not partner has better than a minimum limit raise.
- **3.** Partner's 4H bid is an acceptance of your game try. That is good news for you, because now you can make a slam try, since partner has more than a minimum limit raise.
- **4.** You now bid 4S showing first round control of spades. You are also asking partner if he is interested in slam. Partner now knows that your 3D bid was also a slam try, showing diamonds and/or first round control.
- **5.** Controls (Aces and Kings, singletons and voids) are very valuable when bidding slam. Since partner has a good number of controls (an Ace and two Kings), he is still interested in slam. He therefore bids 5C, showing first round control of clubs.
- **6.** Partner's 5C bid is very good news for you. He has shown a continued interest in slam, and first round control of clubs, meaning you have all 4 suits controlled. You can now bid 6H.
